After a successful seminar this year in Belgrade, with excellent presentations followed by lively discussions amongst young researchers coming from more than ten different jurisdictions, we are pleased to continue for 2025. The 15<sup>th</sup> YRS will take place:

#### About the seminar

The Seminar is a platform of promoting scientific discussion and cooperation between PhD-students in the field of (European) Labour and Social (Security) Law. It is supported by post docs and professors involved with the organisation of the seminar. During the seminar up to 12 selected PhD-students will present (a part of) their research (max 20 minutes), followed by feedback (max 10 minutes) by a PhD-student participating without presentation (co-rapporteur), and 30 minutes of plenary discussion with all the participants of the seminar.

# What topics?

We are looking for presentations of (PhD-)projects of young researchers that concern: International Labour Law, European Employment, Labour and Social (Security) Law, Comparative Labour Law, or at the interface of those fields with national Labour and Social (Security) Law.

### **Submissions**

### 1. Giving a presentation

If you want to give a presentation, you are kindly asked to submit an abstract (max 500 words) by Friday, 10 January 2025, via e-mail to Katja Nebe (<a href="mailto:sekretariat.nebe@jura.uni-halle.de">sekretariat.nebe@jura.uni-halle.de</a>). Participants are encouraged to submit a draft paper.

Abstracts will be jointly reviewed by professors. Selected presenters will be notified by the end of February 2025 at the latest.

# 2. Participation as a co-rapporteur

If you are interested in participating as a co-rapporteur to one of the presentations, please send your application, with a short description of your research interests (max 350 words) by **Friday, 10 January 2025**, via e-mail to Katja Nebe (<a href="mailto:sekretariat.nebe@jura.uni-halle.de">sekretariat.nebe@jura.uni-halle.de</a>).

Please note that for organisational reasons, the number of participating PhD students is limited to 24. Depending on the number of countries represented, the number of PhD students can be limited to 2 or 3 per country.

### Costs

The Martin-Luther Universität Halle-Wittenberg subsidises the seminar: therefore, lodging for two nights, lunches and one dinner can be provided nearly free of charge. Participants have to bear costs of € 80 per person.

Travelling costs are on the account of the participants or their universities.
